## Rules Corner - the answer from previous Cueball

Drum roll please.....

Last issue we asked:

After a foul, you have a free ball and nominate the yellow. You fail to hit the yellow first, so a Foul and a Miss is called. The opponent asks for the balls to be replaced – do you still have the option of the Free Ball?

Answer:

After a Foul and a Miss the ball on is the same as it was prior to the last stroke made. Since Red must have been the ball on for the Yellow to have been nominated as the Free Ball, it remains as the ball on and the rule does not allow for the Free Ball to still be available. So in short, no you do not have the option of the Free Ball.

Thank you to Harold Christensen who was game enough to venture an answer. Hope everyone has learned something here but.....
