Rules Corner - the answer from previous Cueball

Drum roll please.....

Last issue we asked:

Player A breaks off the frame. The scores end up equal and results in a re-spotted black.

Player A wins the toss and puts player B in to have the first shot at the re-spotted black. A stalemate develops and it is agreed the balls need to be re-racked.

Which balls are re-racked?

Who plays the next shot?

Answer:

Only the black is re-racked and the re-spotted black is replayed with player B again having the first shot on the re-racked black. This is a recent change to the rule as previously, all balls would have been re-racked and the frame was started from the beginning. Well done to Carl Caton who got it correct – you've been keeping up with the changes!
