Rules Corner - the answer from previous Cueball

Drum roll please.....

Last issue we asked:

In the event of a Foul and a Miss a player can ask their opponent to play again from the original position. However, if snookers are required this is not the case except in two situations.

What are these two scenarios?

Answer:

If a player has a full-ball contact available to the ball on and has already missed and been replaced once, on the second attempt a Foul and a Miss will be called regardless of the difference in scores. This is because a third miss from the original position will result in the loss of the frame, so you don't get out of it just because you need snookers.

The other situation is when the referee is not satisfied that the miss was unintentional – if you make no genuine attempt to get out of a snooker, the Foul and a Miss can still be called.

Remember we would love to hear from you with any tricky situations you've seen or experienced so we can share them with everyone.
